

# Notice of Public Hearing on Tax Increase

The Bosque County will hold two public hearings on a proposal to increase total tax revenues from properties on the tax roll in the preceding tax year by 9.412075 percent (percentage by which proposed tax rate exceeds lower of rollback tax rate or effective tax calculated under Chapter 26, Tax Code). Your individual taxes may increase at a greater or lesser rate, or even decrease, depending on the change in the taxable value of your property in relation to the change in taxable value of all other property and the tax rate that is adopted.

The first public hearing will be held on September 13, 2010 at 9:00 AM at Bosque County Commissioner's Courtroom-Meridian, Texas 76665.

The second public hearing will be held on September 20, 2010 at 9:00 AM at Bosque County Commissioner's Courtroom-Meridian, Texas 76665.

The average taxable value of a residence homestead in Bosque County last year was \$75,201. Based on last year's tax rate of \$0.371700 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed last year on the average home was \$279.52.

The average taxable value of a residence homestead in Bosque County this year is \$75,629. If the governing body adopts the effective tax rate for this year of \$0.379300 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$286.86.

If the governing body adopts the proposed tax rate of \$0.415000 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$313.86.

Members of the public are encouraged to attend the hearings and express their views.

## **Enhanced Indigent Health Care Expenditures (use if applicable):**

The Bosque County spent \$55,582 from 07/01/2009 to 06/30/2010 on enhanced indigent health care at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is \$12,035.
