Conducts crime scene search investigations. Lifts fingerprints, takes photographs, interviews suspects and takes witness statements.

Writes offense, incident, arrest and impoundment reports.

Informs the community of crime prevention, public safety and public awareness programs.

Appears in court and testifies under oath.

Performs special assignments as required such as investigative, park patrol, enforcement or crime prevention duties.
