

**BOSQUE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT
ORDINANCE # 8**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOSQUE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
COURT, STATE OF TEXAS**

- 1.) It shall be unlawful to construct or maintain an industrial facility motor vehicle entrance or entrances, which access or accesses the same county road, if the industrial facility motor vehicle entrance or entrances are cumulatively utilized or are anticipated to be cumulatively utilized by more than fifty (50) vehicles during any consecutive 24-hour period.

- 2.) For purposes of this ordinance an industrial facility is defined as any location, site, or business with no direct or necessary contact with the general public and includes any processing, manufacturing, or waste disposal facility, including but not limited to solid waste, petroleum waste or petroleum bi-product waste.
